Set between the St-Lawrence river and the mountains, the small village of Kamouraska is known for its beautiful landscape. Built in 1851 and restored to its original glory, the convent is home to the Regional Museum of Kamouraska, a magnificent window to the past and the rich history of this county.

## **OURS EXHIBITIONS**



Three storeys expose the past of the region, presented by local guides dressed in traditional clothing. Found in 1674, the Seigneurie of Kamouraska, agriculture and eel fishing whom were the main source of income will be no stranger to you after the tour. Discover how goods traveled on schooners by visiting the general store.



Discover the story behind the Taché family and the betrayal of the lord while visiting the Seigneurial living room. The guides will also tell you about Anne Hébert and her bestseller Kamouraska, the father of the Quebec Province's flag, Mr. Chaloult and the author of the Canadian national anthem, Sir Routhier.



Immerse yourself in the naval past with the thematic exposition of Prendre les eaux (Taking the waters). Live the experience of tourism and vacations, a signaling of a new lifestyle for the upper class, allowing them to use their free time to flee the urban setting and recharge in one of the most beautiful town of the province.



#### VIDÉO

During the summer of 1759, the Côte du Sud was set a blaze by British commander Scott and his battalion of 800 men, leaving the thriving and populated seigneuries homeless and foodless.

If you love beautiful landscapes and trekking, our guided tour of a small rocky outcrop called "L'îlot Julien" will please you. This tour is in the company of a geologist who will give his knowledge about the geological history of the region. Stories and legends are born from the islands surrounding the area and you'll not want to miss on that!



Taking a guided tour of the streets is a wonderful occasion to discover the beautiful history of the architecture of Canadian homes. A tour of the church is also available. Built in 1917 based on the blueprints of the 1791 church, this jewel will charm you.

If you have time to spare, the *Quai des bulles*, an artisanal soap workshop is worth the detour. You can also visit and watch how soap is made in the back store. The store counter offers a variety of premium quality soaps made with organic and natural ingredients.



After the tour, you can stop by our store, where you can find paintings, books and handmade crafts from local artists.

#### OUR PARTNERS

If you stop by the *Bistro de la Mer* restaurant, you will be delighted with an array of exquisite seafood, ranging from the famous lobster bisque to the flounder burger. All those fresh ingredients are provided by the local fishmonger, the *Poissonnerie Lauzier*, which was found in 1996. The main room, called the second deck can host up to 76 people at any given time. If you want more intimacy, a private room, La Cabine, can be asked, hosting up to 28 people.





Set in a perfect location in the middle of the village, the *Motel des Mariniers* and the *Auberge Manoir de Rose* will allow you to have an incredible and enjoyable evening. Indeed, the sunset



is magnificent and terraces following the St-Lawrence River will charm you.
